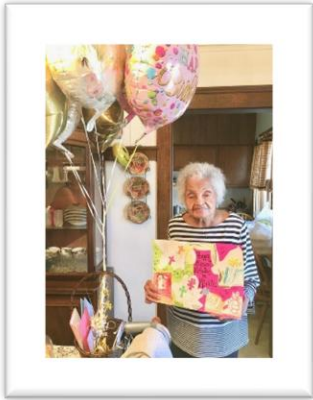


Unconventional Things to Give Up for Lent

Minnie became a member of Calvary on June 17, 1984. Minnie worked at Sunny Acres Hospital where she eventually retired in 1982. She worked for 29 years. Minnie is a talented seamstress. She has sewn many dresses and outfits throughout her life. She taught her daughter Bernadine how to sew. Bernadine remembers making her own doll clothes when she was younger.



Mrs. Doaty and Horace were married for 41 years. He passed away in 1988. The family hosted his homegoing celebration at Calvary Presbyterian Church on July 1, 1988. This was the day that would have been their 41st wedding anniversary. Minnie had 7 children, five are still living. They are, Lois (deceased), Jean, Johnny (deceased), Cornel, Horace Jr., Bernadine, and Thomas. Mrs. Doaty loves flowers. She has planted and maintains a beautiful rose bush in the front of her house. It is a huge rose bush full of red roses. Mrs. Doaty enjoys life! Throughout her life, Minnie has enjoyed her home. She has traveled to many states, such as Michigan, Virginia, and Wisconsin. She hopes to visit South Carolina soon. Mrs. Doaty was a part of the merger of Glenville New Life Community Church and Calvary Presbyterian Church in 2013. She became a Charter Member & Covenant Partner of New Life At Calvary in 2013. She has a total of 39 years membership. We thank God that we can celebrate 104 years of life with Mrs. Doaty, and we praise God for her!
